#### PART - A

The Plan of Action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the year towards Quality enhancement and the outcome by the end of the year

#### 1. Seminars and Workshops National Seminar

IQAC considered the relevance of creating a platform for faculty members, researchers and various postgraduate students to be acquainted with the new trends and developments in various disciplines. With reference to the funds allotted by UGC towards the proposals submitted by the Department of Economics and Department of Chemistry, it is proposed to conduct a national seminar in Economics and a regional seminar in Chemistry during this year. The department of Chemistry decided to organize a regional seminar on "Advanced Trends in Organic Chemistry" at the end of the academic year and the department of Economics planned to conduct a national seminar on "Industrial growth through clusters – An evolutionary approach". It is also proposed the department of statistics to conduct a "Workshop for the Users of SPSS" according as the availability of financial assistance.

#### 2. Interdisciplinary Lectures

Even though students of the College undergoing various courses have excellent in examinations and good records of their study, they often miss

opportunities to have discussions on current events of importance, especially on recent scientific developments and socially relevant. In this view, a committee, Interdisciplinary lecture series committee, is constituted to take the initiative to organize lecturers by reputed speakers from various fields. This endeavor will enable to create opportunities to interact students with such eminent persons of knowledge. This year, it is proposed to conduct speeches on four topics

This year, it is proposed to conduct speeches on following four topics.

- 1. Right to information Act
- 2. Forensic Science
- 3. Time Management
- 4. MGS Narayanan Lecture

Apart from this assignment, the committee is also entitled to make necessary arrangements to utilize the free times of students (due to the leave availed by the concerned teacher as per time table) fruitfully. For this purpose, the committee has prepared a list of faculty members—who are ready to serve along these lines and deploy them as and when required. This is an innovative practice in which students will be exposed to topics other than their subject of study. Practice on use of computer, trainings to improve the communications skills and performance in group discussions, mock interviews—and coaching classes for aptitude tests are certain—programmes offered along this direction.

#### 3. Values of Education Seminar

In order to make our students "finished products" IQAC planned to highlight the importance of values of education. IQAC seriously considered the necessity of making the students role models in the society along with their academic achievements. In this view, this year onwards, it is proposed to organize separate classes and seminars for all degree and post graduate students on various elements values of education. For this purpose, it is decided to identify the most eminent persons who are able to deliver valuable talks on various elements values of education.

#### 4. Career Guidance and Placement Cell

Apart from class room teaching the commitment of a teacher towards his students also includes imparting proper guidance about the scope of various higher courses, especially job oriented, and making available to them various job opportunities as much as possible. IQAC considered these points seriously and accordingly constituted a body to take the initiative of these provisions in the College. The career guidance and placement cell is entrusted to do these assignments. During last year, the cell could tap a number of opportunities for students. It organized a lot of job awareness seminars, campus recruitment training programmes and placement events. However, the impact of recession is expected during the current year. Considering the impact of recession, it is proposed to organize talks and seminars on various courses with better job opportunities even under the influence of recession and also to conduct recruitment training programmes. It is also proposed to start coaching classes leading to Business Administration courses. . This year onwards, the cell is also directed to offer trainings to improve the performance of students in mathematical ability, logical reasoning and general knowledge.

#### 5. Examinations:

Apart from class tests and assignments given to the students as part of continuous evaluation, this year also it is decided to conduct two terminal examinations have been planned, each at the end of the first and second terms. Moreover, in the end of March it is also planned to conduct a university model examination.

#### 6. Add-on Vocational Courses

This year onwards, it is decided to start an Add on course on Communicative English with lot of practical hours in language lab. This special programme will make students to be more confident in communication skills and will be helpful in their personality development. With this aim, it is proposed to renovate the facilities to be provided in the language lab and to install more advanced technologies required. Apart from this programme, the College has also plans to continue the ongoing Add on courses offered by the departments of Physics, Chemistry, Geology and Commerce.

#### 7. Research Orientation

It is directed to organize the "Paper Presentation Day" incorporating project reports of post graduate students and the research achievements of faculty members. It is also proposed to release the "**Research Review**", the annual research journal of the College before 30<sup>th</sup> March.

#### 8. Enhancement of Computer facility

This year the college plans to install a Local Area Network (LAN) including all departments, Administration office, Principal's office and Library. It is hoped that this facility will make the transfer of various important data among the faculty members, office, library and the principal in a very speedy way and the communications will be done with in no time. With a vision to make the library fully computerized, it is proposed to start the issue of books using the bar coding system. The installation process of the system entrusted to the Career Guidance and Placement Cell.

#### 9. Social Commitment Programmes

IQAC felt that creating opportunities for students in tune with the socially appealing activities of Government of Kerala will make them more sociable.

Government of Kerala introduced the concept of "Jana Maithry Police" in which the police become more sociable approachable to common man. As an attempt along these lines, the NSS unit of the College was directed to introduce "Student Policing" – an innovative work at bus stops and junctions during peak hours to control traffic. Moreover, the NSS unit of the college and CSA (Catholic Students Association) were proposed to organize this year number of community service programmes as well as extension activities. In this directions certain programmes have been chalked out including free tuition for SSLC students from poor families, free meals once in a month (Swanthana Sparsam) for all patients of government hospital.

#### 10. Remedial Teaching and Enrichment Programmes

This year also it is decided to pay special attention to weaker and stronger students. At the end of the first term itself weaker and stronger students are identified and special work arrangements are planned to reinforce the weaker students so that they can move along with average students. With an intention uplift the weaker students to mainstream IQAC proposed to engage necessary remedial classes for them and to get the assistance of various faculties in their tough topics. Moreover it is also various enrichment programmes for academically stronger students.

#### 11. Participation of the Alumni Association

IQAC felt that potential Alumni of an institution is really its backbone. It is a body supposed to take part actively in the development of the institution. Therefore it is essential to strengthen this body so that the institution will be lifted to higher altitudes. An elaborate annual meeting is proposed to conduct this year so that many old students are expected to attend it. Moreover it is also decided to honour the outstanding old students of the institution. As a special

programme of the Alumni association a meeting of its UAE chapter has been planned in November 2009.

#### 12. CA Foundation Programme

Considering the request from many students, especially from commerce students, IQAC proposed to start a new coaching programme leading to Chartered Accountancy (CA) internship. It is planned to start the coaching programme at the end of September in this year.

#### 13. IAS Academy

IAS Academy is a special attraction proposed to implement this year. A proposal submitted to UGC last year to start training students for appearing Indian civil service examination was favorably considered and fund was sanctioned towards this purpose. This is in vision to make reachable the civil services for students from semi rural and rural areas. Accordingly, this year it is proposed to start IAS Academy.

#### 14. Exhibition and Workshops

A work shop for secondary and higher secondary school teachers was planned by the Department of Physics. It is supposed to give an opportunity for physics community to be more acquainted with recent developments in their subject. It is also planned to organize an exhibition of "Environmental Awareness" for students under the leader ship of "Enviro Club". The Departments of Geology and Zoology will also assist the club in organizing the same.

#### 15. Free Internet Facility

Being an easiest way of gathering information and for communication, make the internet facility easily accessible was a great dream of students. As another specialty of this year IQAC proposed to start a new free internet facility for students. It is expected to utilize this facility by many students especially researchers and post graduate students.

#### 16. Research Activities

The need of accelerating research activities was seriously considered by IQAC and during this year many faculty members are inspired to submit proposal for conducting minor and major research projects to various funding agencies. They are also insisted to present their former research findings in national or international conferences. Moreover, many faculty members have submitted proposals to UGC, to complete their research work under the FIP scheme of XIth Plan. The proposals of a few faculty members for approving them as research guides are under processing. Those who have been approved as research guides are requested to undertake eligible candidates for doing research.

#### 17. Fine Arts Programme

Kathakali, being one of the famous classical dance-drama of India, it is proposed to conduct a "Kathakali-Noora arangu", a performance and demonstration programme (UNESCO approved programme from India). It is also decided to organize a warm reception to fine arts winners in zonal and inter zonal competitions

#### 18. Merit day

This year it is decided to organize a "Merit day" to honour the top scorers and rank holders in various degree and post graduate courses. Apart form that, it also proposed to honour the award winners among the faculty members.

#### 19. Endowment Lectures

Many well wishers of the institution were generous enough to conduct endowment lectures on various topics. This year it is proposed to conduct the following three such lecturers

#### <u>PART – B]</u>

### 1. ACTIVITIES REFLECTING THE GOALS AND OBJECTIVES OF THE INSTITUTION:

Christ College, Irinjalakuda with excellent track records holds a reputed position among various educational institutions. This institution has a very well defined goals and objectives comprising of imparting glamorous education to its students making them well disciplined and honesty and generating a sense of concern to all beings. The various curricular and extra curricular activities of the institution are planned every year with a keen interest and dedication to achieve these goals.

#### 2. NEW ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES INITIATED:

Proposals for the sanction of new post graduate programmes in Mathematics, English, Malayalam etc are submitted to the university and they are under consideration. It is also decided to submit the proposal for a innovative post graduate diploma in "Forensic Science" and "Fish programme Biotechnology" with more emphasis on field work and practical. The department of English started a special programme to improve the communication skills of the students. With this intention, the language of the department has been renovated and installed various sophisticated instruments. A coaching programme leading to chartered accountancy internship was started in this year. A training programme for students who appear the entrance examination for admission to various business administration courses are also under consideration.

#### 3. INNOVATIONS IN CURRICULAR DESIGN AND TRANSACTION

The department of Mathematics, paying much attention to fuzzy mathematics, organized talks and seminars on that topic. The interest of mathematics students to investigate various mathematical concepts and their contributors initiated to organize a intercollegiate quiz competition.

The department of Statistics gave special attention to students in practicing various mathematical and statistical softwares (like SPSS, Mathcad, Excel). They had also organized PowerPoint presentation on various topics of interst.

The department of Malayalam celebrated a "Vayabadhinam" during this day.

The department of Zoology prepared new charts and down loaded new pictures. They had also collected various new specimen for demonstration.

The department of physics organized variety of programmes focused on Nano Technology and advances in Electronics.

#### Remedial teaching and enrichment programme

In order to bring the weaker students to the mainstream of the class, the class teachers were instructed to identify them using certain criteria. According to that, in each class we prepared list of weak students and students with outstanding performance. After regrouping the syllabus of the courses so that weaker students can digest the contents easily, they were undergone remedial teaching. The bright students were directed to give power point presentations and classes on topics they learnt for other students including weaker students. They were also given certain enrichment programme by instructing to read certain more advanced developments in the same topic and to attend various quiz programmes conducted at other institutions.

#### C. A. Foundation Programme

A foundation programme leading to chartered accountancy internship was started by the Department of Commerce on 25<sup>th</sup> September 2008. Prof. A M Varghese, former vice principal of he College, delivered an orientation class about the chartered accountancy programme ant its job opportunities. Around fourteen degree students from commerce department joined the foundation programme.

#### IAS Academy

An IAS academy was started in the College, to equip the students for civil service examination. The coordinator of the programme was Prof. T I Johnson, Department of Chemistry. The academy was formally inaugurated by Sri V. K. Baby IAS, District Collector Thrissur. In the same function, the College had also given a warm reception to Sri. Ben Varkey, winner of the Indian Revenue Services during this year from the College. The faculty members of Naipunya Institute were instrumentalised to engage the classes of IAS academy.

#### **Add on and Vocational Courses**

It was decided to continue the existing add on courses during this year also. They are, The electronics course offered by the Physics Department and the Diploma course in hygienic Chemistry and the add on course offered by Commerce Department. Moreover, a new add on course on communicative English was launched by English department during this year. This programme will enable students to improve their communication skills and will be helpful in their personality development.

#### 4. INTER DISCIPLINARY PROGRAMMES STARTED

A seminar on "**Right to Information Act**" (RIA) was presented by Sri on. This variety lecture cum discussion session enlightened the audience their right for information and also the legal binding on the people in responsible offices.

A lecture on "**Forensic Science**" was delivered by Dr. Annamma John on 27<sup>th</sup> February 2009. The seminar was very much informative and disclosed various scientific facts that are being used as evidences to prove crimes.

Another interdisciplinary was given by Sri T. R. Unnikrishnan on "**Time Management**" A large number of students attended the seminar. They could be aware of a lot of key points for managing time effectively in their day to day life and appreciated the programme well.

The department of Malayalam had also organized an extremely variety programme during this year. "Kathakali", a famous classical dance-drama, is one of the UNESCO approved arts program from India. We had a stage performance cum demonstration of "Kathakali" by devoted artists from Kerala Kalamandalam, a deemed University. This Kathakali Noora Arangu programme attracted a large number of students as well as the Public of Irinjalakuda.

Along these lines, as a last programme during this year, the History Department conducted a lecture on "Mythology and History of Kerala" on 4<sup>th</sup> March 2009. The world renowned Historian Dr. M.G. S. Narayanan was the resource person of talk.

#### 5. EXAMINATION

The college runs a remarkable machinery for organizing various tasks of organizing continuous evaluation. At the end of the first term and the second examinations were conducted according to the university examination model. Apart from this, class tests were also conducted as and when required. This process of continuous education also includes creating an opportunity to have an open discussion for the parents of students with their class teachers regarding the

progress of their ward. This discussion will enable the students to become more serious and responsible to their academic matters.

Various endowment lectures were conducted during this year. On 31<sup>st</sup> December 2008, Dr. K. G. Poulose, honourable vice chancellor of Kerala Kalamandalam, delivered a talk on "Equity and Excellence in the Field of Higher Education" This lecture was to honour our former Principal Fr. Jose Chunkan.

Dr. V. T. Joy and Dr. Mathew Paul Ukken have already completed their research projects. Dr. V. D. John and Dr. Mathew Paul Ukken were recognized as the research guides of University of Calicut and Bharathiar University respectively.

Dr. A. V. George and Dr. S. Sreekumar were the approved earlier as research guides in Mahatma Gandhi University and they have taken many research students. Five Ph. D. students have joined under the supervision of Dr. A. V. George while four have registered under Dr. S. Sreekumar. Their research works are in progress. Moreover, the research projects of Dr. A. V. George and Dr. S. Sreekumar are also going on.

A research project of nearly eight lacks rupees has been sanctioned for Dr. V.P. Joseph, Department of Physics for the study and development of "Liquid Dielectric Filled Tunable Metamaterials"

Three major projects with financial support of different agencies sanctioned to Dr. John Thomas are also going on with good results.

Teachers engaging classes for all courses were assessed in a very systematic We have considered twenty elements of their work performance, manner. comprising of the mastery of the subject taught, efficiency in communicating the with students, punctuality and sincerity, involvement in research activities, approachability of the teacher and etc. This questionnaire is prepares I tune with the guidelines of UGC. These questionnaires were supplied to asset of 50 randomly selected students of each teacher. Using another questionnaire, the Principal himself will collect the feed back of each teacher. Apart from these we provide an opportunity for parents to give oral feed back about the experience of their ward in the college, academic and infrastructural, in the guardian's meeting of each batch. The teacher used to consider these and comments very seriously and take necessary steps to improve if any required. Moreover., the Principal will hold a discussion with teacher according the feed back he received from students and instruct to take the corrective measures if any required.

# 24. COMPUTERIZATION OF ADMINISTRATION AND THE PROCESS OF ADMISSIONS AND EXAMINATION RESULTS, ISSUE OF CERTIFICATES

The college owns a well furnished office and an effective administration machinery. All functions of the office and the administration are computerized. The admission process to various under graduate and post graduate courses has been doing using an error free computer software. The fee collection of students, salary distribution of teachers, the accounts regarding expenses of infrastructural developments issue and collection of books in library and etc are going on with computer facilities. The attendance of students and their examinations results are also computerized. The progress report of the students as well as certificates of students issued from the office are also prepared with use of computers.

#### 25. INCREASE IN THE INFRASTRUCTURAL FACILITIES

A lot of projects in view of the infrastructural development wee implemented during this year. A lot of renovations including providing separate section for reference, separate seating arrangements for postgraduate students, researchers and faculties were done in the library. A separate roof garden section for serving food is constructed in the canteen. Moreover, floor of the canteen is repaired and put ceramic tiles. New toilets were constructed at key points of the building for boys and girls. The maintenances of all other rooms including office, class rooms were properly done.

# 26. COMPUTERIZATION AND INTERNET ACCESS AND TRAINING TO TEACHERS AND STUDENTS

This year, it made possible to provide free internet facility to all students. The facility was opened by the Principal on 27<sup>th</sup> June 2008. As per the programme, each student can use the facility for one hour if there is a queue and otherwise he can continue as he desires. This facility was received great appreciation from

students and they wholeheartedly welcomed it. The post graduate and research students are exploiting this facility maximum. All the departments of the college own at least one computer and other accessories. We have also proud to say that almost all faculty members are daily users of internet facility and other applications of computer. The college every year conduct an IT Vignan programme with a view to achieve complete computer literacy in the campus.

#### 27. FINANCIAL AID TO STUDENTS

A scheme is established in the college with a view to give financial assistance to a limited number of students for promoting collegiate education. The fund required for this is raised from management students and well wishers. The criteria for availing this aid consists of their academic achievements, character and their financial backgrounds. Apart from this college offers endowments and scholarships to the needy students. These endowments are offered by the retired faculty members from various departments, PTA and well wishers.
