Assessment of learning levels

The learning levels of students are assessed through two methods: Direct and Indirect.

Direct Methods

Screening Test - A screening test was conducted to assess the learning levels of students. The test comprised of three sections; a) English language b) Core subject and c) Psychometric test.

Indirect methods

Student Induction Programme ('Dheeksharambh') - The College conducts an Induction Programme for freshers in which the HOD/Programme Coordinator and the Chief mentor interact with each student. From the individual interactions and the group discussions that follow, the Chief mentor is able to know both the academic level and the family background of the students.

2.3.1 - Student-centric methods such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem-solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences:

Christ College (Autonomous) Irinjalakuda practices various student-centric methods, such as experimental learning, participative learning, and problem-solving methodologies for enriching learning experiences. All the science programs and many of the social science programs integrate practical courses with adequate experiential practice for the students. They also provide a platform for participative learning to the students. Moreover, projects, field-works, seminars, NSS, NCC, etc. inculcate among the students the practice and habit of participative learning and problem-solving methodologies. In all the P.G. and UG programs, there is a compulsory project/dissertation course that provides adequate opportunity to the students for incorporating and practicing problem-solving methodology.

- The academic year 2020-2021 was completely affected by Covid-19 pandemic and therefore it was not only the choice but also the compulsion of the teachers to learn, adapt and practice the ICT-enabled tools.
- However, christ College had all the necessary infrastructure and know-how to shift to complete online learning.
- The IQAC of the Christ College (Autonomous) Irinjalakuda conducted Faculty Training Programme for the development of e-content and the use of e-resources during the year.
- Teaching Learning Centre, Christ College (Autonomous) Irinjalakuda provided faculty Development Programmes for the newly appointed teachers.
- Facilitated by these programmes, the teachers are effectively using ICT-enabled tools like laptops, headphones, writing pads, internet, video lectures, audio-lectures, PPT presentations, virtual labs, YouTube links, e-contents, etc.
- All students and teachers were enrolled in Moodle LMS.

Separate moodle courses were assigned for each batch. The assignment submission, grading, and internal exams were conducted through moodle LMS.

- Teachers started 12 additional courses in Christ OpenCourseWare the open courseware portal of Christ College.

CCRSF has three constituents a) Research seed fund to Research guides b) Research seed fund to faculties of self-financing stream and c) Special Research seed fund to procure instruments

value added courses were started initially out of which six were in partnership with leading certification agencies.

- College is now official testing center for Certiport certification for MOS certifications and RedHat Academy for Linus certifications and Tally for Tally ACE certifications
