as a diplomat he was the right hand man of Patel to unite 565 princely states. His unique intellect and personal strength reached the point where he represented India at critical times. Beyond the expectations of his viceroys he played a vital role in the Partition of India-Pakistan, Kashmir and other major crisis.

We need not follow the example of the Gujarat government which has left the gigantic statue for the crows to pee. Why the government has not done anything aimed to remember V. P. Menon? Is it because he does not come from a political party or studied up to the grade lower than Modi?

When Vallabhai Patel's statue towers over the landscape of Modi, India's unification completely lacks the acknowledged contribution of V. P. Menon. In 1946 even as Nehru's stance on the Viceroy's proposed role in the interim government threatened to torpedo the whole affair, Menon was the one who advised the Viceroy, Lord Wavell to reach out Patel to assure the opinions and solutions.

But it was Patel who was the mastermind of everything. Particularly he thought of an India where everyone is united in religion, culture and language. But V. P Menon was one who held the reins of power with an iron hand. Patel Sardar lived up to Menon's expectations.

Once Sardar has said to Menon's envoy H.V.R. lyengar, "He would not only insist that Congress form the

interim government, but he would resign from the working committee if his position was not accepted. Patel ensured that his views carried the day".

Patel recognised Menon as just the right man by his side as a trusted lieutenant. He was the man who worked up to the needs of nation and the ranks of government service with his powerful Short, stocky, and decidedly blunt with his opinion of words.

Menon was born in 1893, in a little known village some six kilometers out of Ottapalam in Palakkad district of Kerala. His entry into politics and administrative services are mere coincidence and sheer hard work and keen observation on day to day politics. The inherent qualities of Menon appealed instinctively to Patel, who was the principal typist of the first draft of the MontaguChelmsford Report. He had not only helped to implement the Government of India Act, 1935, but also organised the elections of 1937.

Menon was highly experienced in the ways of Jinnah, Gandhiji and Nehru. He handled the various whims and fancies of the viceroy with his sheer brilliance and aplomb. It was Menon's plan for solving the problems of India's independence that had been carried above Lord Mountbatten's plan. Mountbatten's game plan was to split the Indian sub-continent into two countries, by bifurcating into dozen odd provinces, which evoked sharp criticism.

Each province would have the right to repudiate and also each princely state would have the right to become independent. Nehru confronted with burning rage at the prospect of "fragmentation, conflict and disorder". Mountbatten had no other choice but to call his constitutional advisor.
V. P. Menon in his modest guest house typed up his alternative plan gave birth to an independent India that chaged the map of the subcontinent and the world forever. His ability to handle a crisis situation with finesse and poise showing incredible wisdom and sagacity, which made him to be the right hand man of Patel.

Narayani Basu the great grand daughter of V. P. Menon, recently wrote a column in The Wire, where she stated: "The combination of these two personalities was a deadly one. Patel's open contempt for the rulers was tempered by Menon's mix of subtlety, gruff charm and ruthlessness"

The story of the Maharaja of Cochin who won over by the impressive image that Menon laid out for the princesses, whom he likened to a "rare collection of birds" who would not survive upon being released into the wild. In yet another case, he made a special provision for the maintenance of the royal fleet of cars, earning from Mountbatten's press secretary.

Today in this 21 st Century V. P. Menon's role of unifying India are unknown. Alan Campbell Johnson's admiring remark about V. P Menon is worth remembering, "It is high statesmanship that can cover a revolutionary act in the mantle of traditional form".

The act of the BJP Government building the tallest statue in the world for Patel, who never craved for immortality, had in fact made his image shorter. Also by choosing to ignore the man who helped Patel in stitching together the provinces by reorganizing all the princely states into the Union of India, VP Menon should not remain an unsung hero. He was the man behind the legendary tales of Kashmir, Junagadh and Hyderabad. He was the part and parcel for the Indian Union and still remembered by reading Indian political text.

Today, it is a sad paradox that Vappala Pangunni Menon remains buried in Wikipedia with little or no information about his contributions. The Prime Minister Narendra Modi should acknowledge the contribution of the great soul too, if not erecting his statue, at least showing statesmanship in acknowledging the fact that Menon's role in the formation of the modern India is spelt out for the future generation to comprehend.

The Pune police on August 28，in a coordinated operation in different states，had simultaneously raided the houses of several noted human rights activists and arrested renowned Telugu poet and writer Varavara Rao，trade union activist and writer Vernon Gonsalves，rights activist and lawyer Arun Ferreira，trade union activist and lawyer SudhaBharadwaj and rights activist GautamNavlakha， member of the People＇s Union for Democratic Rights alleging links to the banned Communist Party of India（Maoist）．The Police have claimed that the arrests were made on the basis of the violence that followed the Bhima Koregaon Commemorative event held in Maharashtra on 1 January of this year．The police also accused the arrested activists of plotting Rajiv Gandhi style assassination of Prime Minister NarendraModi．The arrests have drawn fierce criticism from the global civil society and political organizations．Human rights activists，writers and academicians have condemned the arrests and accused the efforts as a part of an organised crackdown of political dissent．


The arrests of the activists have led to protests across the nation．The Families and lawyers of the arrested activists have accused the charges and evidence alleged by Maharashtra police fabricated．Maharashtra police have released a letter allegedly written by activist SudhaBharadwaj to Comrade Prakash，member of bannedCPI（Maoist）．SudhaBharadwaj has denied the allegation of letters by Maharashtra police．＂It is a totally concocted letter fabricated to criminalize me and other human rights lawyers，activists and organisations＂，said SudhaBharadwaj in a handwritten statement．When the letters were produced in the Court，senior police officers have denounced the allegation of the letter，which points towards the legitimacy of the accusations made by the Police and the Government against the activists．

The raids and arrests targetting a particular group of society especially Dalit activists，academicians，civil rights activists and political critics are reminiscent of the Emergency in India from 1975 to 1977 when then Prime Minister Indira Gandhi allowing elections to be suspended and civil liberties to be curbed．Today，Government haven＇t made any official declaration on the restriction of dissent but they are trying to censor the political freedom of an individual which is guaranteed by the Constitution．The Government is trying to suppress the voices of dissent raising from the marginalized，oppressed sections of society．From these efforts，the Government is exposing its intolerance to the political freedom and dissent，which are the rights of every Indian citizen．

The arrested individuals were soon branded as ＇Urban Naxals＇，a term used by the right－wing filmmaker VivekAgnihotri as the title for his book．With the arrests of the activists，the term has been widely used by the media， police and Government officials．＇\＃Urban Naxals’ soon became a trend in social media．It is similar to the terms like＇anti－national＇，＇terrorism＇，and＇Love Jihad＇which were intended by the right－wing Hindutva forces．The big media
organizations have played a crucial role in the propagation of the＇Naxalite stories＇with the arrests of the activists．

The Government and the police have shown＇too much＇interest in this case since they are answerable to the murders of GauriLankesh，NarendraDabolkar，CPI leader GovindPansare and rationalist MM Kalburgi．The CBI and Karnataka Special Investigation Team（SIT）has accused extremist Hindutva organizations Sanatan Sanstha and Hindu JanajagrutiSamiti for their inescapable role in these murders．The Central Government haven＇t taken any step towards these organizations．According to a BBC report，since Modi stormed to power in 2014， vigilante cow protection groups have lynched more than 20 people，the majority of them Muslims，for transporting beef．As expected no actions were taken to control the vigilante mob as they were pulling for Hindutva．The nation has also witnessed the rise in the widespread attacks on Dalits and marginalized communities after the NDA Government came into power．Extreme Hindutwa groups have widely used violence and hatred as a tool to obtain power in the minority communities．

Speaking of dissent and freedom of speech and expression guaranteed by the Constitution of India， individuals nor organizations are not free from the censorship imposed by the right－wing Hindutva groups and a Government supporting the latter．The situation is a clear reminiscence of the emergency as these evil forces are targetting the people who are raising the voice of dissent，stands with the marginalized and protects their rights．Beyond the extreme violence conducted around the country in the name of Hindutva，they are trying to kill the ideologies of diversities and those which they consider as threats to their concept of Hindutva，which is again violating the Constitution of India．From all these misconducts，the Government itself is revealing its lack of moral conduct to stay in power．

## So Much More to Over come......

I remember sitting in the gender studies class, When i heard my phone vibrate on $28^{\text {th }}$ of September, 2018. On any other day, I would possibly have overcome the temptation to open my bag and take a quick peek into my phone, but that day was different. I was awaiting a verdict and a historic verdict it was - "SC allows women of all age groups to enter temples," was that the message in my phone. I am blissfully unaware of what the remaining lecture of that hour was about, because my mind had flown back to the innumerable arguments and heated debates that i had got into in class with classmates and friends who had a completely different opinion about the issue. That day would be no different, I knew.

I was aware that this particular supreme court verdict was not one that people in Kerala were eagerly looking forward to, but had the situation not been similarly when the Temple Entry Proclamation had been passed in 1936? Had the Channar Proclamation not been met with the same kind of outrage in 1859 ? Kerala had witnessed such angst before. This one too would pass. A couple of years later, we would probably witness hoardes of young women clad in black clothes and Thulasimalas clamber up the Sabarimala, exhausted, but happy. But I was wrong.


A week later, what i got to witness was that a state that boasted so much of its high literacy so much of its high literacy rates and empowered women was stuck in the dirty muck of political vendetta, strike religious bigotry and a consequent declaration of section 144 at Nilakkal, Sannidhanam, Pamba and Elavungal. I was not surprised this outbreak. What shook me up completely was the sight of thousands of Ayyapa Bhakts attacking vehicles carrying women, manhandling them and chasing them away. The entire argument had been about preserving the purity of Sabarimala was such physical and Verbal abuse of women part of maintaining the sanctity and purity of the Ayyappa Temple? One gender was fighting another gender to protect a god whom they had never seen and they knew nothing about. As usual, men played their masterstroke really well this time too - They made women stand up against women.

It was barely 3 months back that an entire population of this state, men and women alike had stood up bravely in defence against the war that nature had waged on them. Thousands of men had waded in neck - deep water to save women - young and old and pregnant. The very hands that had struggled to pull women out of death were now the ones armed with clubs and lathis to beat up women being seen in the nilakkal vicinty.

The entire episode taught me a valuable lesson - women in Kerala can stay empowered and happy as long as their happiness and empowerment
stays well out of the vicinity of male comfort. The moment men sense a female presence in that vicinity, all hell breaks loose.

Outside college, the scenario was no different. Travelling by buses meant that i got to see a bus dividedinto compartments for men and women. The front rows are female territory where no man dares to venture, while women going and sitting on rear seats is out of question. If a man happens to see an unreserved seat empty, but a woman perched next to it, he'd rather stand for an hour till he reaches his destination. This kind of segregation, in a state that boasts of the highest literacy rates in the country is quite a dichotomy.

When film actor parvathy spoke of misogyny in cinema at the IFFk - 2017, the kind of online abuse that opened up, hit an all - time high. She was issued rape threats and death - threats for one mistake she committed - she spoke her mind. In a state that is ruled by a $\mathrm{CPI}(\mathrm{M})$ led government that has always stood tall and high for individual freedom, that has been against autocracy of any sort, how did a women's expression of opinion open up to so much of hate against her? I saw sexual jokes about her being celebrities - men and women come out and lambast her for daring to malign a star as big as Mammootty. The question here is, was Mammootty the issue or was the uproar caused by the simple fact that parvathy is a woman? Would a male counterpart with the same opinion face the same fate?


Every minute of living here i feel vulnerable and the need to be careful about everything my body, my choice of clothes, my words and even the time i decide to step out of my house. I feel the constant need to convince others that i am a girl with good morals, something i never experienced in nearly two decades of living Uttarpradesh a state known for its ramopant crimes against women.

When the flood hit Kerala in August 2018, i got to see a more united people infused with softer sentiments. I believed that the calamity had brought out their hidden sensitivity and emotion. But ,I was wrong. If a calamity can unite man and woman, ayyappan and Mammootty are enough to turn man against woman.

A few days back, I overheard my landlady talking to her pregnant daughter on phone. The boy's family supposedly wanted a boy at any cost. The worried mother was asking her daughter if there was any means of getting to know the child's sex. are such conversations not similar to the ones mothers and married daughters have in Rajasthan, Haryana and Bihar? I realized then, that newspaper survey reports about Kerala are in stark contrast to the actual picture on the other side of the moon.

We overcome the floods, but there is so much more left to be overcome...

Distaster can be defined as any occurrence that cause damaage, ecological, destruction, loss of human life, deterioration of health and health services. In the context that we have faced a grave disaster, its important to think about disaster and its management. Let's analyse the topic in the light of rescue operations and other activities that took place during the time of Kerala floods. The rescue mission by each and every people is worth appreciable action.

It was an unexpected rush of water into the land of Kerala on the mid August as they have not experienced such a situation for the past 90 years. and let us see what was the management strategy adopted by the 3 crores of people along with their Government.

The first and foremost move to be applauded is that the natives took on charge for the initial rescue operation. They never waited for the forces to come. This kind of sponteneous and appropriate local initiation is the actual factor that mitigated life loss. When we look at similar incidents of floods elsewhere including the Chennai floods we can see that the people were waiting for the rescue forces and this aggrevated their risks. They had made little primary action.

And the Government took up the machinery within no time. Central forces arrived Kerala the district aministrative set up was all ready to give orders and directions. Maps, routes and guidelines were given to the forces. And a kind of priority based rescue operation was on the move. The real emergency

situations were first dealt with．The intervention of youth with media helped a lot in the process．The softwares developed by our youngsters during that time prioritiesed the resue areas．And they had the key to open up social media into a control room．Dis－ trict administration had far sighted vision on various spheres，for their action of capturing petrol pumps give best evidence．

There are other two factors to be focussed re－ garding the rescue mission．It was not only the knowl－ edge of officers or beurocrats that works here but local first hand experiences had to do a lot．And that was the fishermen folk．They know how to use their boats for the operation．The fact here is that the grass root level knowledge and experience can always cre－ ate wonders．And the next thing．．．caste，creed，com－ munity，religion，political backgound，social status were none a point to Keralites during the mission． The sole emotion in them was humaness．Thus Kerala could overcome the flood with a very low death ratio of approximately 300：3 crores which in－ dicates that we were 1 lakh times efficient．

This a short account of what Kerala did imme－ diately．And now lets look into the scientific aspect of distaster management．It is a continuous process of planning，organising，coordinating and implement－ ing measures which are necessary for the mitigatio of any disaster or its rigorous consequences．It is a cycle where prevention or preparedness is the first step．This includes weather forecasting，setting up of warning systems etc．India has shown good effi－ ciency regarding this aspect in some cases like the Failure cyclone．It was exactly predicted by its satel－
lites and we could effectively evacuate people．But the over all efficiency of warning system is to be strengthened．Disaster prone areas are to be given focus．The use of technology into the common people is a necessary thing here．For example，mobile apps can be employed to give instructions to the people in disaster prone areas．It is the lack of this warning system that aggravated risks．Therefore，it should be given importance．

The next step in the process is disaster re－ sponse and relief．We have to correlate different aspects regarading this process．As we had already said the primary respose by natives is the best miti－ gative strategy．But beyond this we have disaster response forces．s In India disaster management is under the Minstry of Home Affairs．We have set up National Disaster Response Force for the purpose and operate from this，our military and paramilitary forces are trained for rescue operations．Along with the coopeartion of forces policy measures and tech－ nological fron have paradigm role in disaster re－ sponse．Proper funding mechanism，information sharing，training and capacity building too have sig－ nificance here．

So far we have been training our forces for rescue activities．But today it is an acceptable idea to provide drills to the common people，especially in teh disaster prone areas．And other cruicial thing to be kept in mind is that is the local administrative who can make effective directions regarding the disaster response of the place．Thnerefore local govsernment bodies and district administrative bodies are to be be ever ready with holistic maps and plans We can

see a good example regarding disaster response in Japan. Being a technically vulnerable area they cop up themselves to confront earthquakes. The type of houses they build, the mode of rescue operations they adopt etc. make the hazard too natural and accustomed for them. You can't hear that schools closes due to earthquakes in Japan and the children will be at schools perhaps on the same day or most probably the very next day of the earthquake.

Disaster rehabilitation, reconstruction and recovery are the the other steps ahead. We have seen effective rehabiliation also had cooperation from various sides. And regarding recovery, there were both mental and physical recovery. The service of counsellors were provided for the weakened and good social bonds could work good here. And the control of epidemics would achieve almost the expected result. The health department was successful enough in awaring people regarding the measures to prevent diseases. The trolls released on Doxy cyclone is a best example. This is a model for the so said process.

And the final step we have long term development. This involves all the above said processes and some extra factors too. To focus on the main point it is policy making. There should be intelligent plans to stop hazards from resulting to grand disasters.

A system which is friendly to disaster management is to be set up. This includes scientific agricultural practices, constructional processes, development activities. The housing and other constructional activities in vulnerable areas are to be given due
importance. Research in this field is to be promoted. Developent process should be inclusive and sustainable.

And finally we should look into the challenges of disaster management. The major among them is people unwilling to cooperate with rescue operations. There were lots of people in Kerala who were reluctant to move from their houses due to emotional attachment and fear of loss of property. Certain baseless beliefs also account for this kind of unwillingess. And the distruction of communication systems, cut down of electricity, scarcity of fuels etc. were also challenges. But all these can be effectively overcome with good public participation. It is awareness and education along the with rational thinking that came make the change here. And thus these are also cruicial factors in managing disaster properly.

Hazards cannot be stopped. But intelligent government policies and machinery along with the effective participation of its people can definitely mitigate the impacts of a disaster. And it is actually what Kerala has shown to the world.
