Muziris was a historic Chera port that is believed to be located at and around the modern-day town of Kodungallur in Central Kerala. During its heydays, the port developed vibrant trade relations with other centres of the Indian subcontinent and the Mediterranean world. There are mentions of this trade emporium in old Tamil texts and Roman records alike.

Muziris Heritage Project is a Kerala government-funded endeavour that aims to bring more awareness about this historic location with the help of various museums. All these museums are set around the old Muziris port or modern-day Kodungallur and Paravur region. Museums are connected by boat services. The college tour group included thirty-five students and four teaching staff. Two project guides also accompanied the team.

The tour was led by Mr Deepak.J, the programme coordinator, and also accompanied by Dr Binu. John, Ms. Jincy S.R., and Mr. Sajiv Varghese. The tour was an enlightening exercise for the participants.



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
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Programme Attained Outcome:

- Interacted with Prof.Kesavan Veluthat, a prominent historian.





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

• Presented papers at the conference.




