BBA <p>Academic Council suggested each board of studies to design new industry-oriented courses and programmes to improve placement opportunities. Expert from industry, Sachin Menon suggested to design syllabus in consultation with recruiting agencies to improve campus placements. He also suggested to start industry seeking programmes like Forensic Science.</p>
<p><i>FYUGP from Academic Year 2024-25</i></p>	<p>Principal Dr. Fr. Jolly Andrews explained the steps taken by the college for the implementation of FYUGP from 2024 admission.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dr. K. J Varghese, Dean of International Relations is appointed as the college level nodal officer of FYUGP • A one-day workshop is organized on 22nd November 2023 to discuss the curriculum framework of FYUGP. • Discussed about the strategies in IQAC meeting, HOD and Coordinator meetings and College Council meetings. • The college is planning to offer double major programmes. Initial level discussions completed within aided departments. • The college forwarded a request to the university to seek permission to utilize the courses offered by the unaided departments for aided

	<p>students and vice versa.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Each board of studies of the college appointed committees for the formulation of curriculum and syllabus of FYUGP. The college is waiting for the draft of University of Calicut curriculum and syllabus for the finalization in consultation with the university. <p>University nominee Prof. Dr. Jos T Puthur mentioned that the college is proceeding in the right path for the implementation of FYUGP. He suggested the board of studies to formulate the strategies for all possible pathways.</p> <p>The Academic Council suggested the departments only offering PG programmes to consider the possibility to offer double major programmes and new minors for the students of other departments. Academic Council also suggest the various board of studies to introduce new minors by adding recently developed attractive concepts and take steps to attain permission from university board of studies.</p> <p>Academic Council decided to approve the FYUGP committee appointed by the college and also suggested to forward the double major proposals from various departments to the Governing Council for the approval.</p>

The board also requested the name change of BVoc IT to BVoc IOT and Data Science. • The BOS of Library and Information Science requested to transform B.Lib..Isci to two year Integrated M.Lib.I.Sci programme. • The BOS of Sanskrit department forwarded a syllabus change suggestion in the grammatical distribution of the Sanskrit common paper for UG programmes. <p>Academic Council approved all these suggestions.</p>
