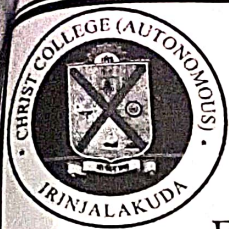
He noted that the activities of NSS, NCC, Thavanish, CSA, and other clubs were highly commended by the NAAC peer team.
