Institutions of parliamentary democracy, for example, and the limited liability business corporation, did not exist 400 years before. Institutions of global governance, such as the United Nations and the World Trade Organization, did not exist even 100 years ago. These institutions were invented to enable human societies to produce better outcomes in their citizens. They have been put through a severe stress test now by the global health and economic crises. The test has revealed a fundamental flaw in their design. There is a mismatch in the design of governance institutions at the global level with the challenges they are required to manage. Designed like machines for efficiency, they are trying to fit itself into an organic system of the natural environment coupled with human society. It seems that government institutions are rectangular pegs forcing themselves into round holes.
