3. What role does the river Manas play in ‘Salapila’s’ symbolism? [Level:4] [CO1, CO6]
4. What does the “mainour” (stolen object) symbolize in the film ‘Thondimuthalum Driksakshiyum’? [Level:2] [CO2, CO4]
5. What does Manto compare his stories to when he says they reflect society? [Level:2] [CO5, CO6]
6. What does the line “My English swallows the articles cause it’s always hungry” in the poem 'My English' suggest about deprivation? [Level:2] [CO4, CO5]
7. Mention one instance in the song 'Cement Kadu' where religion is questioned. [Level:4] [CO1, CO4, CO5]
8. Interpret Mahasweta Devi’s statement: “Culture must once again remind us to be a tolerant and truly secular people.” [Level:4] [CO2, CO6]
9. Analyse how the thief defends himself in the movie, *Thondimuthalum Driksakshiyum*. [Level:4] [CO4, CO6]

14. Examine how migration for work exposes the Santhal community to exploitation and danger in 'November is the Month of Migration'. [Level:4] [CO2, CO5]
15. Examine how the poem 'To Waris Shah' mourns the destruction of Punjab's cultural landscape during Partition? [Level:5] [CO3, CO5]
