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






4. <u>06/07/19</u>

3. 20/07/19










4. 03/08/19

Some of the worked places are GUPS vellangalloor school, St. Joseph school Parappukkara, VHSS and ALPS school karalam, GUPS Vallivatam school, Balavedi School and pompie school Kattoor. Apart from this many volunteer had volunteerly gone for cleaning activities in Nilambur and other flood affected areas. The NSS volunteers of Christ college, Irinjalakuda had cleaned HDP Samajam School, Edathirinji, Irinjalakuda and prepared the school for a new relief camp.

As a part of flood relief activities, the NSS volunteers of Christ College with the help of Thavanish and Catholic Students Association of the Christ College had started a collection center in College auditorium and collected necessary item valuing around 18 lakhs. R, on August 20th 2019 supplied necessary items to the people of Panamaram and Sultan Batheri, Wayanad which was the worstly affected due to flood. Also, the volunteers helped the flood affected areas of Palakad by supplying 250 essential items kits.






<u>September – October 2019</u>

2. 24/09/19






The volunteers had their lunch at 12:30 pm. The afternoon session was practice for upcoming street play and Flash mob. The work came to an end by 3:30 pm.





3. 24/11/2019






December - January




3. 25/01/2020

They gave information's regarding fire, emergency exits, first aids, safety measures, precautions and so on. They demonstrated how to make a stretcher with a bed sheet and two sticks. They also demonstrated the rope escaping ideas and fire extinguishing with water and foam. They taught us how to use fire extinguisher and give

information regarding it. Many information's regarding the fire station were given by the firemen. The session was really helpful to learn some public awareness with demonstrations. It came end by 1 PM. Then the volunteers had their lunch. They all shared their food each other. Thus, sharing came a strength between the volunteers.

The afternoon session was a discussion on republic day. A tableau competition was held for the volunteers. They were divided into 8 groups and allow them to discuss on the topic for tableau. The next session was a class in a projector room were Mr.Anil gave an idea about the wrong practices that we perform daily. He also put forward some changes that we have to follow every day in order to have a healthy life. This session came end by 1.45 pm and now it was time for the lunch break. After having our lunch, we were divided into 2 groups and then, we visited the museum. One of guides accompanied us who told the history of Ayurveda, which spread worldwide by the disciples of Charaka. In Kerala 18 moos practiced Ayurveda, but now only 4 of them exist. One of them is Eledath Thaikkattu Moos It is now owned by E. T. Neelakandan Mooss.

There in the museum, a small piece of rock from the moon was placed. At last, we spot a plant, which was really interesting because it was a dancing plant. Their leaves begin to dance when the music was played. We also tasted many basils which flavored lemon, mint and so on.

It was an amazing experience that gave a lot of useful information's. Along with fun, this trip gave an idea about the Ayurveda and the services provided by this medical institute. Around 3.15 pm we started our return journey.

In the afternoon session the volunteers visited the wards and interacted with the residents. It was a good one day work to the volunteers to help others and to interact with them so as to get a view of life around them.



2. 22nd to 24th February 2020 – Insight



$6. \quad 11/03/2020 - 19/03/2020$


