Day 2






A photo session was arranged by which the workshop concluded.




Number of calls and feedback was given both by the participants and the resource person which encouraged the organizing committee to conduct more such programs in future.









institution's commitment to recognizing and celebrating excellence, both within its alumni community and among current students. **Special Guest - Dr. V P Gangadharan**
















Outcomes
